UNC Pembroke Faculty Brass Quintet - MONDAY, March 29, 2010

The UNC Pembroke Faculty Brass Quintet is one of the most active chamber ensembles in the Southeast region of North Carolina. The ensemble is dedicated to bringing chamber music for brass to all people. The group's members are active instrumentalists who also perform as soloists and orchestral musicians across the United States and Europe. In addition to upcoming performances on the UNC Pembroke campus, the UNC Pembroke Faculty Brass Quintet has performed throughout North Carolina, most recently at the North Carolina School of the Arts in Winston-Salem. The ensemble performs all styles of music from the Beatles to Bach and Ewazen to Ellington, and can be heard on the UNC Pembroke Department of Music's newest Compact Disc release entitled "Music America."

The Osiris Duo is a classical guitar duo formed in 2008, as collaboration between John Porter and Christian Loeb to explore the vast range of guitar music from its earliest beginnings to present day composers.
