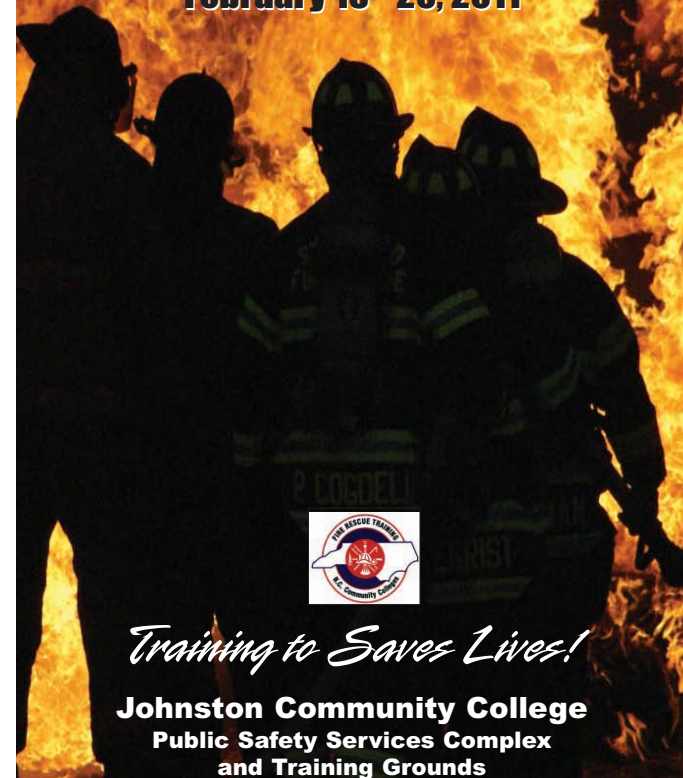

LIST OF CLASSES FOR THE WEEKEND FIRE/RESCUE SCHOOL FOR FEBRUARY 18 - 20, 2011:

1. Law and Administration

Instructor: Barrett Graham

Course Description: This class covers the legal aspects of enforcement of the North Carolina State Building Code by way of a general overview of the process. Required texts are North Carolina Administrative Code and Policies (2009 edition) and Rules of the Code Officials Qualifications Board.

2. Chief 101

Instructor: Chris Perry

Course Description: This class will satisfy the 9S inspection criteria as specified by the North Carolina Administrative Code. The primary objective of this course is to inform current and future chief officers of the various aspects and complexities surrounding the operations and organization of North Carolina Fire Departments. Emphasis will be placed on rating and inspections, NFIS reporting, prevention and grant programs, basic line-of-duty death information, financial considerations, and an overview of the various expectations facing a chief officer.

3. High Angle/Confined Space with Eastern Environmental Management

Instructor: Mike "Tink" Tinkham

Course Description: This intensive, hands-on course will challenge the student with a variety of scenarios combining confined space and high angle rescue. Students should bring a working knowledge of technical rescue and an open mind. Equipment required: Class 3 harness, rescue type helmet, gloves, clothing appropriate for the weather, eye protection.

4. Building Construction for the Fire Service

Instructor: Jonathan Sowers

Course Description: This class will challenge the Fire Command Officer to think about a cultural change in the way they attack modern day structure fires. Lightweight construction materials and synthetic contents are causing fires to burn hotter, faster, and less predictable. Topics discussed include: case histories, reading smoke, and discussion on the five types of construction emphasizing lightweight/engineered construction and how we can safely attack fires in these structures.

5. NCDOT Rating System

Instructor: Kent Hood

Course Description: This course covers information pertaining to your ISO inspection and gives insight on how your department can lower their rating, to benefit residents and businesses in their district.

6. Basic Electricity for Firefighter and Investigators

Instructor: John Edwards

Course Description: This course defines electricity, how it is produced, and distributed. It explains the typical household electrical system with demonstrations of the electrical faults that may produce fires. It provides the firefighter or investigator with the basic knowledge and skill to competently evaluate the electrical system for electrical fire causes. This course covers NFPA 921 "Guide for Fire and Explosion Investigations" chapter 8 on "Electricity and Fire".

7. LP Gas Emergencies

Instructor: Don Heres

Course Description: This course is designed for fire suppression personnel with a basic knowledge of tactics that need to be mastered when dealing with incidents involving LP Gas. This course will discuss and practice such topics as nozzle manipulation, hose stream selection and properties of LP Gas. This course will consist of live burn scenario drills to be held on the Fire Training Grounds. Students must have a 1403 verification from signed by a Chief Officer of the sponsoring Fire Department. Full PPE and SCBA are required.

8. NFA Firefighter Safety and Survival: A Company Officer's Responsibility

Instructor: Tramp Dunn

Course Description: This course builds awareness in the critical problems of firefighter deaths and injuries in emergency and non-emergency situations and provides risk-reduction skills to help make firefighters safer. It is highly recommended that every member of the fire service complete this course.

9. Training 4 Survival

Instructor: Perry Hall

Course Description: This course prepares the firefighter for survival on today's fire ground. The student will be placed in life threatening situations, using real life props, to learn methods of survival. Participants will be tangled, lost, trapped, and disoriented in exercises to learn self rescue techniques. This class is "Everyone Goes Home". Equipment requirements: Full Turnout Gear, SCBA with spare bottle. This class is scheduled for 16 hours and will begin at 7:00pm on Friday. Friday evening attendance is mandatory!

10. Hybrid Car Extrication Considerations

Instructor: Mark Haraway

Course Description: This class will introduce the student to many of the new safety concerns found in new vehicle construction today. The class will be centered on the Alternate Fuel Vehicle including hazards associated with Hybrid Vehicles as well as other fuels such as Hydrogen and Methanol. The student will also gain an understanding of new vehicle construction to include airbags, new exotic metals and some suggested methods of how to address these new issues in the extrication setting.
