The
CERTIFIED INTENSIVE CARE PARAMEDIC

program was created by the

**Cleveland Clinic Health System-Western Region
EMS Academy-Division of Critical Care Education**
to establish a national standard of education, and training,
for those interested in advancing their careers to the
critical care level.

The **CICP** program is divided into three components:

- CICP Pre-course
- Didactic Lecture / Lab
- Skills / Clinical Experience

CICP Pre-Course

“Guidelines for Air Medical Crew Education,” written by The Association of Air Medical Services (AAMS), is utilized as the textbook for the CICP Pre-course

Written by nationally recognized leaders in critical care medicine in-hospital, as well as ground/air critical care transport, the material provided in the CICP Pre-course provides you with the required base-level knowledge that will serve as the foundation as we advance to the high acuity level medicine covered in the didactic component.

Understanding the time constraints that we all face in our lives, we have placed the ENTIRE CICP Pre-course textbook **ON-LINE** for your convenience.

All of the material is presented utilizing the Blackboard learning system, and is available 90 days prior to the start date of the didactic component.

Each chapter is followed by a short quiz that will verify your knowledge level of the material covered.

The completion of pre-course on-line requirements grants the students **50 hours** of continuing education units.

CICP Didactic/Lab

The **112 hour** didactic classroom/lab component compliments the material covered in the CICP Pre-course by providing you with the progression of the material you will need to advance your understanding, and abilities, to the advanced level of high acuity patient care.

Lecture topics provided in this component of the program are written by Physician’s, Nurse’s, Paramedic’s, and Respiratory Therapist’s, involved in the care of patients in a variety of settings, and is the extension of the information into the realistic settings of in-hospital, and ground/air critical care transport

In addition to the medical information covered in the CICP program, we will also cover the specific components of the ground/air critical care transport industry to ensure your understanding of all environments, and stressors, to which a critical patient may be exposed.

Equally important, we will cover all of the social, behavioral, and legal, aspects that are encountered in the transport industry.

All students successfully completing the requirements of the CICP program are qualified to sit for the FP-C exam.

All of the material provided in the CICP program is reviewed annually by Attending Physicians within the Cleveland Clinic Health System to guarantee the most up-to-date patient care information available.

CICP Skills/Clinical

All students enrolled in the CICP are able to develop a stronger understanding, and appreciation, of the knowledge learned, and skills practiced, in the didactic setting, by experiencing the day-to-day patient care that utilizes the knowledge, and the skills learned.

Students are required to complete **36 hours** of clinical experience in a variety of transport and hospital critical care settings, prior to course completion.

CICP Course Fees

CICP Course fee is \$270 for all students.
Optional Continuing Education/Exam prep is offered through the CICP Pre-course textbook and web access for additional cost, details available in class.

CICP Pre-course, Didactic and Clinical are three components combined into a registration fee of \$175 per course for non-Affiliated students.

Affiliation refers to Paid or Volunteer members of an emergency service provider for the purposes of fee-exemption. A letter on letterhead and signed by the organization chief or training officer verifies affiliation.

Total Student Cost: \$270.00 and Affiliated fee-exempt
