



Course Title: Tactical Mantracking for Law Enforcement **LEVEL II**

Course Description:

The LEVEL II Tactical Mantracking Course, Level II of the **Tactical Mantracking** Course takes the students to a higher level of tracking proficiency. Honing the tracking skills, and teaching them apply those skills to real world situations and environments.

The student will be stressed to use the skills to mantrack at night and in urban settings through city streets and alleys, yards, parking lots and sidewalks. They will learn how to use concealment and stealth to track up to and conduct surveillance on subjects, and learn to detect and avoid ieds, and booby traps that may be placed along the way to harm them.' They will also learn anti and counter tracking techniques and how to recognize them when used by fugitives or illicit drug manufactures to mask their tracks or conceal their operations. Students also learn to use their tracking skills to backtrack a subject to place them at the scene.

Many of these techniques and skills can be employed in the successful search for lost, or missing persons.

Scope:

To train Law Enforcement Personnel to use tactical tracking as a tool for conducting operations in situations like those listed below...

- Crime scene tracking and footprint evidence collection.
Search and Locate missing persons
- Urban Tracking.
- Pursuit of fleeing felons and escaped inmates.
- Illegal militia/separatist investigations.
- Rural narcotic investigations.
- Border violations (drugs, weapons, illegal immigrants).
- Investigation of gang activities in rural areas.
- Protection of sensitive facilities and sites (DOE, dams, power plants, closed Federal lands, etc.)
- Hazardous waste dumping
- Natural resources investigation
- Poaching.
- Rural crime task forces
- Rustling and cattle theft.
- Reconnaissance, intelligence and surveillance
- Search and rescue.

Course Objectives:

1. Teach members of law enforcement how to enhance and utilize ancient art of tracking man.
2. To recognize and exploit valuable information left by the quarry, and identify threats to the tracker.
3. Using tracking techniques to recognize and identify IEDs and booby traps.
4. Hone the basic tracking techniques and safely apply them to backtrack a quarry.
5. Learn anti / counter tracking techniques and to identify them when used against the tracker.
6. Learn the tactics of tracking up to and utilizing a surveillance position utilizing 100% camo and concealment .
7. Given scenarios locate, process, and track quarry over and through an urban environment.
8. Learn the methods and tactics of tracking at night.

Prerequisites:

Prerequisites: Sworn Law Enforcement, Corrections, SAR Personnel currently employed by a municipality, county, state, sworn company police, or federal agency.

- Level I Tactical Mantracking course or equivalent.
- Having passed the agency physical requirements within the past 12 months.
- No medical profile prohibiting strenuous activity
- Capable of walking 5 to 10 miles per day over various terrain
- Qualified to carry departmental firearms

Text and supplies needed:

Gear and Kit list for Tactical Mantracking Course Level II

Day 1: Attire: BDU type. Boonie style hat, LBE, ruck sack or pack, Hydration system, eye protection, rain gear, tactical gloves optional but recommended, any additional duty gear used in actual operations. To include weapons or training weapons.

Foot ware should be a tactical or sport tread pattern

Note book and pen or pencil, Compass (every day), pocket note pad and pencil, tape measure,

Day 2-5:

Attire: BDU or type clothing. LBE, ruck sack or pack, hydration system, head gear preferably boonie style, eye protection, rain gear, tactical gloves optional but recommended, any additional duty gear used in actual operations.

Kit: Compass, retractable tape measure, small ruler (6-8"), pocket note pad and pencil, standard note pad and pen for classroom, eye protection, lunch and energy snacks such as trail mix, daily. (all lunches after day 1 will be held in the field) HYDRATION and electrolytes. Civilian attire for day 4 (Urban Tracking)

Optional Equipment:

Ghili Gear if you have it, Camo face paint (for day 3), Map case, Binoculars, hand held or wrist GPS, duty weapons or, training weapons,

Remember, train as you fight. If you'll use it in the real world, bring it to training.

Requirements for successful completion of course: Successful completion of practical exercise and/or completion of exam
