Purpose:

This training is designed to assist law enforcement officers in the interdiction of criminals using a commercial motor vehicle. It will provide the skills needed to make a rapid assessment of a commercial motor vehicle traffic stop. This training will also show common concealment methods used by criminals to transport illegal items while in transit.

Officer Lane Thompson Hoover Alabama Police Department

Prior to becoming a law enforcement officer, Lane Thompson worked as a local and over the road commercial truck driver, giving him inside knowledge of the trucking industry. With over 12 years of law enforcement experience Officer Thompson previously worked as a Deputy Sheriff in Douglas County, GA before joining the Hoover Police Department. Currently he is assigned to the Hoover / Jefferson County Highway Safety Unit working interstates I-20, I-59, I-65, and I-459. Officer Thompson is certified through FMCSA to perform DOT inspections. He has performed over 800 inspections throughout his career.

Officer Thompson has been recognized in State and Federal court as an expert witness in the field of criminal interdiction. He has a one hundred percent conviction rate in State and Federal courts, and has often been recognized for case preparation and court room testimony. Officer Thompson has been personally responsible in the seizures of over 5 million in U.S. Currency, over 375 pounds of cocaine, and over 2,000 pounds of marijuana. He has been responsible for locating numerous hidden compartments within commercial motor vehicles.

Officer Thompson is currently a certified instructor for EPIC/DIAP and the FBI. He has received numerous awards for his accomplishments in criminal interdiction as well as EPIC Instructor of the year.
