



Admission Requirements

Students should complete and submit an admissions application. Applications are accepted for admission Fall Semester and Spring Semester (applicable to certain programs). Students must be 18 years of age.

Students must have a high school diploma or equivalent to receive financial aid.

Students attending cosmetology programs without financial aid do not need a high School diploma or GED. Students must complete a placement test satisfactorily.

Students must have official transcripts forwarded from high school and colleges attended. Students must be interviewed by Admissions Counselor if accepted and submit satisfactory physical and emotional health information required. For specific admission requirements refer to Johnston Community College catalog and the Admissions Office.
