Thank you for your interest in the Emergency Medical Science – Paramedic Certificate Program. This shift friendly course means you can choose from the available days which day you want to come to class. The course will include online coursework via the Internet, campus classroom work, psychomotor lab sessions, hospital clinical, field internship and evaluations. This program meets the EMS Education Standards and AHA Guidelines. Upon successful completion of the program, the student will qualify to take the NC Office of EMS Paramedic credentialing exam and National Registry Paramedic exam. The 2018 – 2019 Paramedic Certificate Program will start June 4, 2018 for “Monday” class and June 7, 2018 for “Thursday” class.

Program Description

The Paramedic Certificate Course provides individuals with the knowledge, skills and attributes to provide advanced emergency medical care as a paramedic for critical and emergent patients who access the emergency medical system, and prepares graduates to enter the workforce.

Students will gain complex knowledge, competency, and experience while employing evidence based practice under medical oversight, and serve as a link from the scene into the healthcare system.

Graduates of this program are eligible to take state and/or national certification examinations. Employment opportunities include providers of emergency medical services, convalescent ambulance services, fire departments, rescue agencies, hospital specialty areas, industry, educational and government agencies.

Program Information

The EMT-Paramedic is the highest level of training in the pre-hospital setting. Student training includes use of complex medical equipment, such as manual monitors/defibrillators, administering of various medications and performing skills per State and National standards. Students receive certifications in numerous additional practices such as Advance Cardiac Life Support (ACLS), Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS), Advanced Medical Life Support (AMLS), and Prehospital Trauma Life Support (PHTLS). Students learn the necessary skills needed in today's ever evolving medical field to recognize, treat, and reverse life threatening conditions.

Student Information

The Certificate Paramedic Program is a yearlong course divided into two divisions. Each division includes didactic, lab and clinical hours. Students attend a shift-friendly schedule meaning classes meet once a week, normally either Monday or Thursday 8:30 a.m. - 5:30 p.m. The same subject matter taught on Monday and Thursday so the student can choose what day to attend. The course includes mandatory weekend classes to allow the course to end in one year. Alteration in the Monday/Thursday schedule occurs when holiday's fall during the week. Students get a fall, Christmas and spring break throughout the course. The course schedule is provided at the beginning of the course.

Paramedic Certification Program Admission Process

Step One: Pre-Admission Process

- Complete Paramedic Certificate Program Application. See attached application.
- Submit with program application:
 1. A copy of valid state driver's license
 2. A copy of EMT credential or proof of successful completion of an EMT course
 3. Documentation of high school graduation or GED
 4. A copy of valid AHA Health provider BLS/CPR card
 5. If applicable, documentation to be exempt from Entrance Exam (See application). Must be official documentation.

JCC accepts applications at any time for the Paramedic Certificate Program, but applications are assigned to a course based on available space. The application deadline for the 2018-2019 Paramedic Certificate Program is [April 27, 2018](#).

Submitted applications as soon as they are completed. This will allow time for entrance testing and completion of the application process.

Step Two: After notification of acceptance from Paramedic Program Coordinator

- Complete a JCC Registration Form and submit to the Paramedic Program Coordinator
- Pay Registration Fee for Div. I. **For fee exemption, student must be on a current Johnston County Roster or out of county students must submit a letter from their provider on official letterhead that states, name, position, the necessity of course to his/her position and the student is in good standing with the provider.** Fee exemption is approved based on criteria set forth by The NC Community College System.

Step Three: After student has successfully registered for the course and before the Course Starts.

- Attend a program orientation session located in the Public Safety Building, Room J1360. Sessions are scheduled for:
 - May 14, 2018 from 09:00 am to Noon **or**
 - May 15, 2018 from 09:00 am to Noon

Before Course Begins: (Discussed in detail at orientation)

- Purchase access to Platinum Planner and EMSTesting. Access codes can be purchased at Johnston Community College Bookstore or on-line at www.platinumed.com when you register. Purchase instructions will be provided at orientation.
- Purchase class resource materials:

 - Additional resources are required for specialty classes offered during the course (ACLS, PALS, PEPP, PHTLS, AMLS). Prices vary depending on where you make your purchase. Certification cards can be purchased from the Johnston Community College Cashier Office before the course is taught. Specialty Books can be borrowed for class. Certification cards are optional.

- Certified copy of Transcript for verification of A & P requirement. If a student has taken an A&P course that meets NC OEMS requirements, documentation must be submitted for verification. Courses that meet the requirement include:
 - EMS 3000 or
 - Bio163 or
 - Bio165 and Bio166 or
 - Bio168 and Bio169

Must be completed by July 15, 2018 (Completed & documented uploaded onto Castle Branch Profile)

- Complete a background check, urine drug screen and submit immunizations records through CastleBranch.com. Students must purchase access and upload all documentation to their profile. More information provided at orientation.
 - Immunizations are: Influenza Vaccine (prior to Flu session); Tdap (with tetanus booster within last ten years); TST Skin Test (2 injections) within one year or CXR within 6 months; Hepatitis B Vaccine Series, + Titer, or Declination Form; Varicella Vaccine or + Titer; and MMR Vaccine (2) or + Titer
- Complete a medical form, physical exam and health history. “Physical Examination by Medical Practitioner” document available on CastleBranch site.
- Purchase coverage Liability umbrella policy through Johnston Community College. Coverage purchased at JCC cashier’s office in the Wilson Building during normal business hours.
