

CRRSAA Student Funding Final Report

- Johnston Community College (JCC) acknowledges that the institution signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and assures that the institution intends used the funds received under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund II (HEERF II).
- JCC received \$1,129,190 in total funds from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
- The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund II (HEERF II) as of April 14th, 2021 is \$1,129,190. CRRSAA Grant funds have been fully expended.
- The estimated total number of students at JCC eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund II (HEERF II) is 3,630.
- JCC awarded 1,028 students an Emergency Financial Aid Grant under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

- **In accordance with Department of Education guidelines, JCC distributed CRRSAA emergency funding to eligible students by the following method:**

JCC determined which curriculum students received Emergency Financial Aid Grants, and how much they received under the CRRSAA by using a prorated amount from \$1,248 to \$625 depending on their EFC (Expected Family Contribution) score from their completed 2020-2021 FAFSA, and the student having a federal and/or state aid disbursement for Spring 2021 by April 6, 2021.

- EFC score = 0: \$1,248
 - EFC score > 0 and ≤ 5711: \$937
 - EFC score > 5711 and ≤ 8500: \$625
